Create birds

Age: 7-14

Topic: Art and Biology

Time: 30 minutes



What should learners already know?

- Birds may have many different colours, shapes, and sizes.

What equipment will I need?

- Possibly a white cloth as a background

How will learners explore this?

1. Go out and see if you can spot a bird.
2. What does the bird look like?
3. What colour are the legs, beak, and feathers?
4. Is the bird big or small?
5. When you have looked closely at your bird, it's time to create a model of it.
6. Look for natural materials that you can use to create your image of the bird.
7. Create your bird directly on the ground or on your white canvas.
8. When you are happy with your bird, take a photo of it as a memory.

How can we show the learning?

- Ask children what they noticed about the bird they spotted.
- How many different types of birds were spotted in the class?
- What natural materials did children use to create their bird model?
- Going out to watch birds is fun. It is a way to learn about which bird species can be found just around the corner.
