

Overview

This activity involves making a bow and arrow with sticks and string and supports responsible decision making.



Activities

To make a bow you will need one strong, flexible stick (willow is great for this).

Tie string on one end, then lean the end on the ground. Apply pressure so the stick bows and tie the other end of the string to the top of your bow.

The flex in the stick creates the tension on the string.

Find a shorter arrow for the bow.

Equipment

- Sticks of various lengths
- String
- A target to aim at, for example a tarpaulin with a target on it or a balloon to pop

Safety Tips

Agree clear and simple rules with children in terms of carrying, space and where to aim the arrows. A bow licence, for example a sticker, acts as an agreement, no licence, no bow. Create a store for future use.
